 - Categorical Imperative: Actions are guided by universal moral principles that individuals must adhere to regardless of the consequences.
 - Duty-Based Ethics: The rightness or wrongness of actions is determined by whether they fulfill one's duty and adhere to moral rules.
 - Principle of Ends: Individuals should be treated as ends in themselves, not merely as a means to an end.
 - Other key concepts (which are considered if you mention them) can be the following:

- Principle of utility
 Principle of good will
 Focus on actions and consequences
